

The **Elsmere Fire District**, operating out of 15 West Poplar Drive, has been meeting the fire protection needs of the 9,100 residents of the Bethlehem Hamlet of Elsmere since 1922. The Department currently has 78 volunteer members, operating four pieces of fire fighting apparatus, including a 100ft aerial and operates as a component of the Capital Region Hazardous Materials Response Group. The **Delmar Fire Department**, with two locations at 145 Adams Street and at 803 Feura Bush Road, is staffed by over 80 professionally trained volunteers, protecting the community

since 1911. The Department's firefighters use two engines, a ladder and a squad to protect more than 13,000 residents 24 hours day, 365 days a year. Through our partnership with the Bethlehem Emergency Medical Services we house 4 ambulances. The **Selkirk Fire District**, formed in 1928, encompasses an area of 33 square miles with a population of over 8,500 and an extremely large commercial-industrial complex, including the Selkirk rail yard (CSX). The District also protects seven miles of Hudson River shoreline and seven miles of the NY State Thruway. The Fire District offers protection through its three locations in Selkirk, Co. #1, Glenmont, Co. #2, and South Bethlehem, Co. #3, and has a combined roster of 70 volunteers with 13-pieces of fire apparatus including a fireboat, UTV and 2-foam trailers. The **Slingerlands Fire Department** was formed in 1928 and proudly serves the residents of the Hamlet of Slingerlands and a portion of the Town of New Scotland. The Fire Department has two locations; the main station at 1520 New Scotland Road, Slingerlands and a second station at 1144 New Scotland Road in Albany. The Slingerlands Fire Department is widely known for their rescue expertise and was the first up-state fire department to receive the "Jaws of Life" in 1972. The **North Bethlehem Fire Department**, located at 589 Russell Road, serves the Elmwood Park Fire District which protects residents in the Towns of Bethlehem, New Scotland and Guilderland. The fire Department is an all volunteer department established in 1948, and operates two pumpers, a rehab squad and an EMS first responder unit.
