SECTION I

AUTOMATIC MUTUAL AID RESPONSE PLAN

(This plan is a supplement to the
Town of Bethlehem Volunteer Fire Officers Association
Emergency Preparedness and
Mutual Aid Plan)

A. DEFINITION OF AN INCIDENT

The movement of a piece of fire service apparatus, equipment, or fire personnel in response to an alarm of an emergency that involves injury or life hazard to ten or more people or an emergency of any kind which involves a hazardous material. A hazardous material shall be defined as any of the following:

Explosives, Chemicals either dry or liquid, Poisons, Petroleum products or Radio-active materials.

B. DECLARATION OF AN INCIDENT

Will normally be declared by the senior officer of the first arriving Fire, Police, or Medical unit. However, if the initial report of the emergency to the dispatcher indicates an obvious incident has occurred or is about to occur, the dispatcher should immediately activate the plan.

- 1) Incident Zones - The town will be divided into five zones consisting of the five Fire Department districts as follows:

<u>Fire District</u>	<u>Zone</u>
Slingerlands	1
Delmar	2
Elsmere	3
Selkirk	4
North Bethlehem	5

- 2) Incident Codes - Where applicable, incidents will be declared so as to indicate the severity or impact of the incident with respect to potential or actual loss of life and/or property, and effect on the environment. Those incident codes designated by - 2 indicate a greater impact than codes designated by - 1.

<u>Incident Type</u>	<u>Code Designation - Impact</u>
Structure	A-1 or A-2
Vehicle Accident	B-1 or B-2
Bomb Threat	C-1 or C-2
Hazardous Material	D-1 or D-2
Light Aircraft	E-1 or E-2
Heavy Aircraft	F-1 or F-2
Natural Disaster	G-1 or G-2
Extra Equipment (Air Bottles, etc.)	H

Any code designation should also be announced phonetically. Note: See explanation of Code H designation. For Codes A-1 through G-2, all mutual aid apparatus will report to the staging area unless otherwise directed.

3) Code H Explanation

Initial Plectron Announcement

Will be as follows:

"All Departments- Code H - Zone _____ (zone of district where request originated) - for _____ Fire Department (Name of department where request originated) - For Additional Air Tanks".

Responding Department Procedures

All responding apparatus will check out with the dispatcher. Response will be to the Elsmere Firehouse (unless otherwise directed) to consolidate requested equipment. Equipment will then be transported to the fire scene using the least number of apparatus needed. All radio transmissions will be to the Incident Commander or his designee at the scene.

Example of Call to Zone 2 - Delmar - Air Bottles

Announcement:

"All Departments - Code H - Zone 2 for Delmar Fire Department - for additional air tanks".

Response:

All responding departments will meet at the Elsmere Firehouse. The requested items (air tanks) will be consolidated, including the Air Bank, into one or two pieces of apparatus and then respond to the scene. Elsmere Firehouse will be the consolidation point for all Code H requests. The department where the request originated will not be activated due to the fact that they are already involved in the initial call.

Note: This Plan is intended for activation within the Town of Bethlehem, but may be used for transporting equipment to outside areas if requested.

C. DISPATCHER'S RESPONSIBILITY

Notify Fire Department and Rescue Squad that are to respond in the area. A running list and order shall be provided by each District as to their requirements for a certain Incident code. Each District should include their staging area(s). This running list will be part of this plan.

After a Code D Incident has been declared, the following should be activated:

- 1) Additional Police - See Town of Bethlehem E.P.P., pg. 5-1
- 2) Assistance for Dispatcher - See Town of Bethlehem E.P.P., pg. 5-1
- 3) Chemtrec Notification - The dispatcher, or the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) if operational, upon request of the Incident Commander, will call CHEMTREC (1-800-424-9300) and advise them of the incident. Information for CHEMTREC will be a form provided. Report back to the Incident Commander all information supplied by CHEMTREC.

Central dispatching should be prepared to play a major role in communications and notification of outside agency resources.

D. POLICE ASSIGNMENTS

All available and assigned to duty Police Officers, as well as, fire police are to report to the staging area as soon as possible. They will be under the direction of the senior or ranking Police Officer at the scene. See Town of Bethlehem E.P.P., pg. 6-1

E. ADDITIONAL DISPATCHERS

Upon activation of the plan, the Town Dispatcher will be the operational station for the duration of the emergency. Additional operators and dispatchers should assist at the station as needed. These personnel should be from adjoining districts or regular dispatchers as assigned and be prepared to assist at the E.O.C. See Town of Bethlehem E.P.P., pg. 5-1

F. ADDITIONAL AMBULANCES

If additional ambulances are required, they should be so notified through the REMO plan by the Senior Medical Officer.

G. HOSPITAL NOTIFICATION - IMMEDIATE FIRST AID

The first arriving ambulance will be in charge of triage, treatment, aid stations, transportation, and hospital notification.

H. FIRE OPERATIONS

Will be directed by the Incident Commander or his designee at the Command Post. Fire Operations Commanders, (Assistant Chiefs, Captains, Lieutenants, or Fire Fighters) will report to the Incident Commander at Command Post. Their function will be rescue, incident control, fire suppression and evacuation.

I. RESCUE OPERATIONS

Will be directed by the Incident Commander or his designee and will be accomplished by fire and rescue personnel.

J. RADIO FREQUENCIES

Fire Radio frequency usage shall be as follows:

- Frequency 1: Dispatching/Staging
- Frequency 2: Fireground Operations
- Frequency 3: Fire Police

SECTION II

The Incident Commander, Police Liaison Officer, Senior Medical Officer and Agency Resource Officer will report to the Command Post as established by the Incident Commander.

A. INCIDENT COMMANDER

The Incident Commander will be the ranking Officer at the scene in the District in which the incident occurs. A command post will be established. All pertinent information shall be funneled through the Command Post. The Incident Commander shall designate responsibility as he sees fit to other Officers and Personnel.

B. POLICE LIAISON OFFICER

Will be the senior or ranking Police Officer at the scene or a designee of the Police Chief; and a Fire Police Officer.

He will assist the Incident Commander with all matters involving Police, including arranging and securing assistance of outside Police agencies and evacuation as needed.

C. SENIOR MEDICAL OFFICER

Will be a member or Officer of first arriving ambulance unit. He will assist the Incident Commander in all matters involving care of injuries and communication with all rescue squads and hospitals.

D. PUBLIC RELATIONS OFFICER

See Town of Bethlehem E.P.P., pg. 7-8

E. STAGING OFFICER

Will be appointed by Incident Commander(s) and be stationed at the designated staging area. He will be responsible for directing any apparatus to respond from the staging area to the scene. Any request for staging apparatus to respond to the scene should be directed through the staging officer.

F. AGENCY RESOURCE OFFICER

Will be appointed by Incident Commander and will assist the Incident Commander in assessing need for and directing resources of outside agencies at the scene.
