RE: Changes in the Local Law relating to Traffic Control

DATE: July 8, 1993

The Traffic Safety Committee has received a complaint from a citizen regarding the confusing and dangerous traffic flow situation where the driveways of the Bethlehem Central Middle School intersect with Kenwood Avenue. The concern was also echoed by several police officers who also perceived the problem. In the course of our investigation, we determined that there were in fact, accidents resulting from a lack of clear flow patterns.

Coincidentally, the Bethlehem Central Transportation Safety Committee had been studying ways to improve the traffic flow and increase safety within the school property. Their suggestion was the routing of traffic, one-way in, the western most driveway and one-way out, the eastern most driveway with a Stop sign controlling traffic from the parking lot entering Kenwood Avenue.

Based on our study and in concurrence with the Transportation Safety Committee, this committee recommends the designation of:

1. The western most driveway of the Bethlehem Central Middle School at its intersection with Kenwood Avenue as one-way South.
2. The eastern most driveway of the Bethlehem Central Middle School at its intersection with Kenwood Avenue as one-way North.
3. A Stop intersection at the intersection of the eastern most driveway of the Bethlehem Central Middle School and Kenwood Avenue controlling northbound traffic from the Middle School driveway.

While researching Chapter 119 of the Local Laws relating to Vehicles and Traffic, it was noted that under section 119-29 Schedule III, there exists a designation of a portion of Thatcher Street as one-way. Since the reconstruction of Route 9W at this intersection, the aforementioned portion of Thatcher Street no longer exists, therefore I recommend this item be repealed.

ADD: A stop intersection at the intersection of the eastern most driveway of the Bethlehem Central Middle School and Kenwood Avenue controlling northbound traffic from the middle school driveway.

SUPERVISOR RINGLER: Next I have a request from Bruce Secor, Commissioner of Public Works, for consideration of water service for LaGrange Road. Let me read this into the record.

SUBJECT: Request for Out-of-District water service  
Property of Dr. and Mrs. Jones  
LaGrange Road, Slingerlands

Attached is a copy of a letter from Mrs. Jones requesting consideration for water service on LaGrange Road which is off of New Scotland Road in Slingerlands. LaGrange Road is a private road or

driveway not plowed or maintained by the Town. This property is in the Town of Bethlehem and attached is a map showing the 93 acres.

Dr. and Mrs. Jones plan to build in an area of the parcel which is highlighted in yellow on the map. The existing Water District includes part of the 93 acre parcel but not the portion they intend to build their home on. A 12" water main exists on Route 85 and is shown on the drawing. The owners are not certain how they plan to develop the remaining 93 acres. Therefore, at this time, I would recommend that if a water tap is granted as an "out-of-district" customer that a small diameter line be installed with a meter pit near the water main and that a private water service be run along the private road to their home site. At such time they determine how they are going to subdivide the property, we could then make a determination for a location of a properly sized water main, fire hydrant location and consider a formal Water District Extension to include the entire parcel.

I see no problem in granting "out-of-district" service to the home site as requested since the parcel is in the Town, partly in the Water District and has direct access to an existing 12" water main. Please contact me if you have any questions or need any further information.

SUPERVISOR RINGLER: Does anyone have any questions?

COUNCILWOMAN GALVIN: I have a question on the letter that was attached in support from Keegan Associates. Bruce, they recommended a 2" diameter K-type copper lateral.

MR. SECOR: K-copper is just a flexible.

COUNCILWOMAN GALVIN: But, is a 2" what you were talking about?

MR. SECOR: Yes.

COUNCILWOMAN GALVIN: Okay.

MR. SECOR: Whether they use copper or plastic, it really doesn't matter. It would be up to the homeowner to decide.

COUNCILWOMAN GALVIN: But, their recommendation would be acceptable to you.

MR. SECOR: Certainly, it is not going to provide fire protection but it will certainly provide their use.

COUNCILMAN GUNNER: Just for one residence.

MR. SECOR: Yes, and there is an existing hydrant right at the intersection of LaGrange Road and Route 85 so if the fire company had to lay into that, they would have a hydrant right at the end of the property to start from.

COUNCILMAN GUNNER: How far about is that?

MR. SECOR: I would say -- Mrs. Jones is here -- from Route 85 into the house site, 800-900 feet, 1,000 feet, what do you think?

MRS. JONES: Better than 1,000 feet, closer to 2,000 feet.

MR. SECOR: All right, almost 2,000. But, the problem is is they don't have a layout for the subdivision. To try to run a 6 or 8 inch water main, you don't know where you are going.

COUNCILMAN GUNNER: Right.

MR. SECOR: So, that is why I think it is untimely to do that.

COUNCILMAN GUNNER: You are aware of that?

MRS. JONES: Am I aware of what?

COUNCILMAN GUNNER: Well that you inquired whether that gives you adequate fire protection for your own benefit.

MRS. JONES: Right, but I was led to understand that the fire trucks have hoses that would be able to go off of that. That was what I was told when I inquired.

COUNCILMAN WEBSTER: Yes.

COUNCILMAN GUNNER: Yes, he is also a fire Commissioner.

COUNCILMAN WEBSTER: Your current residence is further in than this new house.

MRS. JONES: Right, I would hope they could come up.

COUNCILMAN WEBSTER: Right, the current residence is deeper into the property than the new house will be.

MRS. JONES: I am building closer to the road.

COUNCILMAN GUNNER: Okay, I just wanted... since a new one is being built.

SUPERVISOR RINGLER: Of course, you are making another commitment for another fire district.

COUNCILMAN WEBSTER: No, it is not a fund time and I am not representing the Slingerlands Fire District.
