



The **Elsmere Fire District**, operates out of locations at 15 West Poplar Drive (North Station) and 578 Feura Bush Road (South Station). It has been meeting the fire protection needs of the 8,000 residents and 398 businesses in

the Elsmere Fire District since 1922. The Department currently has 65 volunteer members, operating four pieces of firefighting apparatus, including a 100ft aerial along with three fire engines. The fleet also consists of three support vehicles as well as three command vehicles. Their long time motto, "The Pride of Bethlehem", still resonates strong today in their emergency capabilities as well as their extensive community involvement. The **Delmar Fire Department**, with two locations at 145 Adams Street and at 803 Feura Bush Road, is staffed by over 60 professionally trained caring men and women volunteers, devoting their time to protecting the community by providing fire and emergency service since 1911. The **Selkirk Fire District**, formed in 1928, encompasses an area of 30 square miles with a population of over 8,500 and an extremely large commercial-industrial complex, including the Selkirk rail yard (CSX). The District also protects seven miles of Hudson River shoreline and seven miles of the NY State Thruway. The Fire District offers protection through its three locations in Selkirk, Co. #1, Glenmont, Co. #2, and South Bethlehem, Co. #3, and has a combined roster of 56 volunteers and nine pieces of fire apparatus including a fireboat. The **Slingerlands Fire Department** was formed in 1928 and proudly serves the residents of the Hamlet of Slingerlands and a portion of the Town of New Scotland. The Fire Department has two locations; the main station at 1520 New Scotland



Road, Slingerlands and a second station at 1144 New Scotland Road in Albany. The Slingerlands Fire Department is widely known for their rescue expertise and was the first upstate fire department to receive the "Jaws of Life" in 1972.
